World Languages Program

Summit Christian Academy (SCA) honors bilingualism by offering a Seal of Biliteracy to students in grades 8-12 who have attained an advanced level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in the Russian Language.* The Seal of Biliteracy is placed on the Summit Christian Academy transcript and on the Seal of Biliteracy certificate indicating that the student has earned the seal.

*Other languages may apply per request, review, and SCA School Board approval.

The Level of Proficiency:

- 1. *Novice proficiency* means basic skills are acquired, yet there is very limited real-world functional proficiency. Novice proficiency is used primarily in academic settings. Students can earn two (2) credits (*Grammar* and *Oral*) to meet the minimum for meeting high school graduation requirements.
- 2. *Intermediate proficiency* means a practical amount of real-world applications and fluency are acquired. Intermediate proficiency indicates the use of the language effectively in both the community and academic settings. Students can earn three (3) credits (*Grammar, Oral,* and *Literature*).
- 3. *Advanced proficiency* means a student is fluent in the real world. Advance proficiency is required in many professional careers, depending on the context, and is acquired in post-secondary education. Students can earn four (4) credits (*Grammar, Oral, Literature*, and *Writing*).

Requirements for Prospective Students:

- 1. Evidence of studying the Russian language for four years, as a minimum, before applying for an exam. Must be in a good academic standing.
- 2. Evidence of heritage speaking: confirmation of using/practicing the Russian language in the home, church settings, and/or local bilingual community.
- 3. Evidence of English language proficiency per report card/transcript proof with a minimum of 3.0 GPA.
- 4. Recommendation from a teacher/school official of readiness to take the exam.
- 5. Demonstrate proficiency through the competency-based exam as indicated above.

Requirements for Co-Op Schools:

- 1. Have the World Language (Russian) already in place at the high school level.
- 2. Teachers must take and pass the Russian Language and Culture course through Northwest Nazarene University (NNU). *Note, the SCA World Language Coordinator teaches the course.*
- 3. Send a recommendation letter to SCA indicating that a student meets the requirements for the exam(s).
- 4. Assist SCA with the competency-based exam requirements; the exam will be monitored.
- 5. Collect, seal, and send by mail the test results immediately after taking the test.

Requirements from Summit Christian Academy:

- 1. Provide professional development, guidance, and support for the schools offering the Russian language.
- 2. Evaluate, grade, and award level of proficiency.
- 3. Issue SCA transcripts, Seal of Biliteracy for students who met the advanced proficiency level, and send by mail to the students/schools.
